Dear Parent:

You are receiving this letter because you are a parent or guardian of a child in care at 1306 CO HWY 7 Business Route, Allenspark, Colorado 80510. The Office of Early Childhood, Division of Early Care and Learning, is the agency responsible for the licensure and inspection of child care facilities in Colorado, including resident camps. The goal of the Office is to ensure that children are in healthy and safe child care. There are times however, when a child care facility is not able to meet all of the licensing standards and action is necessary.

You are receiving this letter because Presbyterian Highlands Camp has agreed to enter into to a settlement agreement with the Department, beginning on July 31, 2019 and expiring on July 31, 2022. This means that the facility continues to operate on a permanent child care license and must maintain compliance with specific conditions of the settlement agreement. During the settlement period, Presbyterian Highlands Camp will be monitored through inspections and will receive additional technical assistance towards the successful completion of the settlement requirements.

The reason for this settlement agreement is because of substantial evidence of an act of institutional child neglect (medical neglect) by a Presbyterian Highlands Camp staff member. More specifically, in the summer of 2018 a seasonal program staff member failed to seek medical care for a camper after observing that the camper became ill and vomited after falling multiple times. Presbyterian Highlands Camp has worked to correct licensing violations by updating health care policies and procedures, providing staff with additional training on head injuries, and hiring a full-time nurse to oversee implementation of the health care practices. You can help support the facility by making sure you keep your child's camp records updated.

The terms and conditions of the settlement agreement are listed on the settlement agreement. The settlement agreement is required to be posted so it is easy to see when you enter the facility. Please take time to look at the camp license and settlement agreement and familiarize yourself with them. If you have any questions about the settlement agreement, the facility's license, or if you would like to request copies of reports of inspection, please do not hesitate to call 303-866-5948 and ask to speak to the Licensing Supervisor on duty for a review of this file.
